



Competition License Scheme

1. General

This internal regulation covers the issuing of competition licenses to individual persons who are members of BMF member Clubs and sets out the terms and conditions of such licenses. These regulations may be modified from time to time by the General Assembly of the BMF.

The position of Chief Licensing Officer is created within these rules and such post shall be filled by a person appointed by the General Assembly from time to time.

2. Registration of Competitors

Any person in order to qualify as a competitor in the territory of the Barbados Motoring Federation (BMF) must be the holder of a Competition License issued by the BMF. The license holder must present proof of same to event organizers on request and state the license number on any event entry form. In order to hold a licence an individual must be a member of one or more member club of the BMF.

3. Eligible Parties

- (a) A subject of any territory being part of the territory of the BMF and being themselves a member of any Member Club.
- (b) A national of any other country after receiving authority from the Motor Sport Governing Body of that country so to do.
- (c) Over the age of 18 or National and International licences
- (d) Member in good standing with the issuing Club
- (e) That the competency criterion has been satisfied as set out from time to time.

4. Categories of License

There shall be three categories of licenses with cumulative privileges as follows:

- **Restricted:** eligible for karting, navigational rallying, co-driving and dexterity tests (\$25 annual fee).
- **National:** eligible for all forms of motorsport within the territory
- **International:** valid for presentation to any ACN or ASN outside of the territory

5. Refusal and/or Revocation of License

The BMF may refuse to issue or revoke a license under the following conditions:

- (1) If the applicant fails to meet the competency criteria
- (2) Upon application by any Member Club to the BMF showing just cause as to why the individual should not hold such licence
- (3) At the request of a duly authorized public authority
- (4) On a resolution passed by the General Assembly
- (5) If the individual ceases to be a member in any and all Member Clubs

6. Period of Validity of License

Licenses shall be valid from the date of issue to the end of the calendar year in which it is issued unless previously surrendered or revoked by the BMF. If withdrawn or revoked, notice of such shall be issued in writing to the holder as well as to all members of the BMF.

7. Production of License

A competitor or driver at a meeting and or event shall produce the license on demand to an Official of that Meeting or Event.

8. Assumed Name.

If a license is required in an assumed name, special application must be made stating the reasons for consideration.

9. Application for license.

The method of applying for a license shall be as follows:

- a.** A completed application form (appendix to these rules) stating the Club to which the proposed competitor is a member, their identification information and the category of license for which he/she is applying shall be sent to the Chief Licensing Officer.
- b.** The Club's Chief Licensing Officer shall ensure that the form is correctly filled out and the required documentation and fee pertaining to the category of license sought is accurate and attached (e.g. medical certificate, copy of drivers' license, proof of age, applicant's indemnity, parent/guardian's indemnity, driving course qualification certificate etc.)
- c.** The BMF Chief Licensing Officer shall enter the information into a Register of Competition Licenses and shall approve such license providing that all information is completed and appears accurate.
